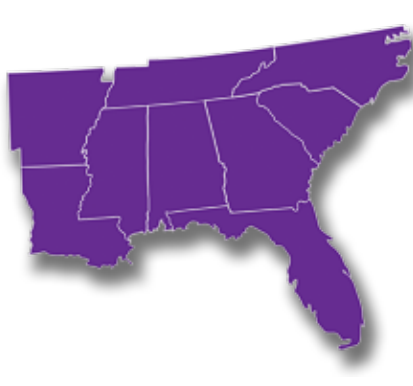

Northeast Region

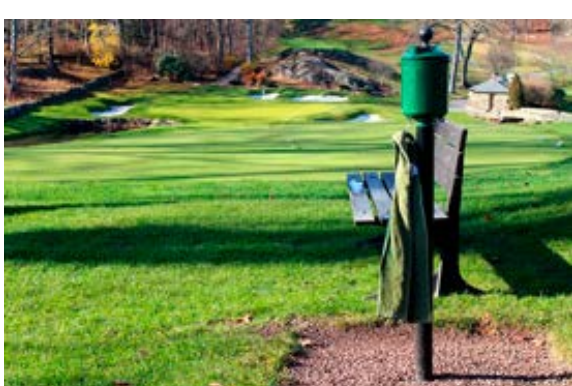
