In the Northeast Region, turf covers can be invaluable tools for some golf courses and unnecessary for others. This update should help clear up any confusion.

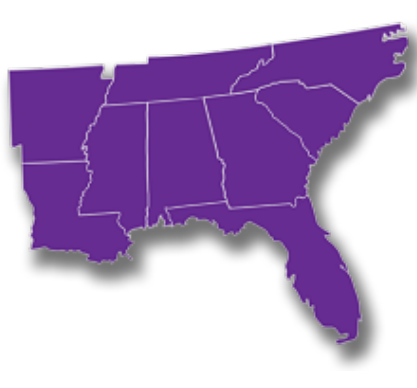

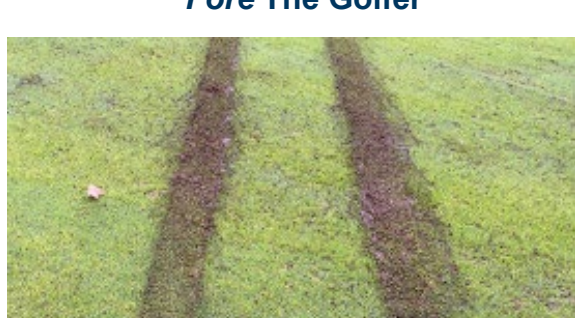
